From the Pastor's Porch

As I write this, we are in the midst of summer weather with the arrival of spring. Lunches and reading on the porch have been delightful. I occasionally find myself wondering what this early warmth means for the coming of real summer. However, there isn't much we can do about the weather, except be diligent about finding ways to reduce "global warming" with the hope of shifting away from the erratic weather around the globe. If you have been part of the Lenten Carbon Fast e-mailings, you will have received all sorts of suggestions along with some links to more detailed information.

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son...not to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him" (John 3: 16-17). While the scripture seems to be referring to humans, we must not lose sight of God's creation as also being loved by God, and our responsibility to care for all of it, as good stewards of what God has given us.

With April 1st comes the beginning of Holy Week with our celebration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. The service will reflect that joy but will conclude on a more somber note. It is a mistake to leap from the joy of Palm Sunday to the rejoicing of Easter. The inbetween time is important. We move with Jesus from triumphal entry through his betrayal by Judas, his arrest by the authorities, the denial by Peter, and finally Jesus' trial and painful execution on the cross. Without entering this dark valley, Easter's significance is lost. I encourage you to come to the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services at 7 pm and open yourselves to the most important story of our faith. Then on Easter morning, you will know Jesus' victory over death and the promise of salvation and eternal life, and together we can sing "Alleluia" once again.

It is hard to know all that will occur in our lives during the month of April, but there are some things for certain. The week of April 15 – 21, members of our faith community, along with a couple of friends outside our church, will be traveling down to work in Mississippi serving those still trying to recover from Hurricane Katrina, working with Back Bay Mission in Biloxi. Please remember to hold in prayer the missionaries and the people they will be serving. April 22nd, Patricia Bjorling, Associate Conference Minister for Generosity of the CT Conference of the UCC will be preaching. Also, on the 22nd will be the third part of the "Preparing for Life's Journeys" program following a soup and bread lunch after worship. And on April 29 we hope to hear from some of our missionaries about their experiences in Biloxi.

I don't know what nature has in store for us, but I know our faith can be made strong by coming together and by living into the Easter story and the good news Christ brings.
