Together we sparkle as the United Church of Christ in Columbia. Together with other churches we offer hope and peace and promise to the world through our joint ministries. Jesus called the ordinary individuals to gather together and become fishers for people, men and women and children, by reflecting the light of Christ and the joy of living in God's grace in all seasons of life.
