From the Pastor's Porch

On Memorial Day I finished most of my planting. Everything is in a pot or a planter of some sort. Now, I am not at all sure I can be a successful container gardener, not having much success last year. It's not the same as planting in deep rich earth. It is more demanding of my attention – watering deeply and more often and feeding with organic plant food at the right times. The soil actually came from bags purchased at the store.

My gardens of years ago were deeply dug with compost worked in at the beginning and worked into the soil each year. In the spring or early summer I covered the soil with mulch between plants and then all I needed to do, other than enjoy, was water during the dry spells and snatching out an occasional weed or pinching off dead flowers or harvesting the vegetables. Although the early work was labor intensive, once established I felt I could let go and let God, through nature, take care of the gardens, something far more in line with my style of being.

While Memorial Day, around here, is the start of the summer for plants, summer for many begins in the middle of June. June is the month of pearls, and roses, graduations and weddings, the end of school days and the beginning of summer days. (Congratulations to our children who are graduating from High School.) In the church, the choirs and Sunday school teachers begin their recess, and I offer many thanks to both groups for their dedication throughout the program year. I look forward to their return in September. June is a month for change.

However, some things remain the same. There are still 24 hours in the day and 7 days in the week. Sunday is the first day of the week on our calendars, which should remind us enriching our faith should be first in our lives. Worship, while often shorter than the rest of the year, continues every week at 10 in the morning and is a great way to keep a bit of routine. We still need to feed and water our souls, nurture our faith, be reminded that for all our doing or not doing we belong to God. We do better when our roots are sung deep in the soil of God's love. After that, we can let go and let God, through the Holy Spirit, guide our days.

The Memorial Day Observance

at the Town of Columbia

On a sunny warm morning, 1st Selectman Carmen Vance began our observance with a welcome at 9:00 a.m.

The Star Spangled Banner was sung by Maya Keleher, followed by Columbia Boy Scout Troop Flag Detail lowering the flag to half mast.

An invocation was offered by Pastor Betsey, followed by a moment of silence for deceased veterans.

Matthew Gorman played Taps.

Ingrid Wood, President of the Columbia Historical Society offered a Dedication of the Rochambeau Plaque.

We then proceed on foot to the Revolutionary War Cemetery (“Old Yard”) where Maya Keleher read *Memorial Day* by Joyce Kilmer, and Matthew

Gorman played taps in honor of the deceased veterans.

Again on foot, we moved on to Center Cemetery where the BSA Flag Detail lowered the flag to half mast. Ingrid Wood read *The Sentinel at the Gates* by John Puzo, followed by Matthew Gorman playing taps for those veterans buried there.

A motorcade processed to West Street Cemetery where 1st Selectman Carmen Vance read *The Bivouac of the Dead* by Theodore O’Hare. Those gathered listened to taps played by Matthew Gorman.

All headstones at veterans burial sites were decorated with field flowers and flags placed by Columbia Boy Scout Troop #162.
