FROM THE PASTOR'S PORCH

Though late in October, the day was relatively warm, the brilliant sun resting on everything and anything it could. Many leaves had already drifted down, been blown down, been tossed about into crisp piles, swished into blankets over grass and ground-cover alike. My cherry tomato plants are still producing and the petunias still blooming, appearing out of place now we are deep into the fall season. The cat, Elliot, and I sat in the soul soothing sun, cushioned by the fading floral pillows on the deacon's bench on the porch. A couple of months ago, I would have had to retreat to the cool of the house and soon it will be too cold, but, this day, this day, it was perfect.

As I watched another golden leaf dance its descent, I remembered raking leaves with our daughters, building great piles for them to disappear into so they could then burst out like a roaring monster ready to eat me alive. We raced around the yard, only to fall back into the now-not-so-big pile, tossing handfuls of brown, gold and red at each other. Our black lab, Toby, would get so excited she would run around in circles, leaves rustling and flying, as she barked madly at our crazy antics.

Now, sitting on the porch, I realized I have shifted into being a spectator. Smiling knowingly as the children walking on the path between the library and gazebo, shuffling their feet, swooshing leaves about, finding joy in the sound, I take great pleasure in the season, but I am not out there in it.

Certainly, I am older - and you might be too. Racing about, rolling in leaves, and chasing friends or children through the rustling of leaves may be something you physically can't do. And being a spectator is not all bad. After all, most of us never played in the NFL, or the NHL; became the first violinist or a member of the Hartford Symphony; a prima-ballerina, or a member of the corps de ballet. But, as spectators, we can feel the thrill of the game; enjoy the concert, or the ballet.

Church, however, is not intended to be a spectator sport; although there are times in our lives (life challenges, diminished capability) when being a spectator is right where we belong. In general though, being church, the Body of Christ, the community of the faithful, calls for active participation. In worship we sing, pray, listen, and read together. Even here there is room for greater involvement: reading the scripture (you don't have to be a Deacon), giving the children's message, offering a joy or concern, sing in the choir. Participating in the activities of the church - serving on a committee or board, working at the breakfast, or attending special activities will all make you, and the church, richer. UCC minister Rev. Molly Baskette wrote "get out of spectator mode and find the courage to be really seen."

As we approach this season of thanksgiving, we, as a church and as individuals, can find much to be thankful for, not the least of which for the blessing of God's presence in our everyday lives. Those now in the late season of their lives may be more limited in the ways they can participate than those in the spring and summer of their lives. However, we can all dance like the leaves of fall for all to see the freedom and joy in which we live, using God-given gifts and talents, courage and wisdom.

Come to the church fair (Nov. 2)(bake, sell, or come and see/buy). Enjoy fellowship and the shrimp dinner at the Biloxi Shrimp Boil (Nov. 5). Help at the church breakfast (Nov. 9). Join our neighbors in Andover for our Community Thanksgiving Service on November 26 here at Columbia Congregational Church at 7:00 pm. Then plan to enter Advent as an active member of this Body of Christ, full of anticipation and awe as we search together for the significance of this season and of our lives in Christ.
