FROM THE PASTOR'S PORCH

As I write this, there are still piles of snow on the ground and the wind today makes the chilly temperatures feel even worse, but that does not deter me from feeling the hope that comes with Easter and spring. That these two go hand in hand seems totally logical.

In terms of the seasons, we have gone through 6 weeks of two snow storms every week giving us bleak winter weather. This left us practically hip deep in frigid white, and drifts and plowed snow over our heads. It has been hard to imagine new growth pushing through the rock hard earth, and hard to remember that hibernating creatures have been sleeping through it all. While I have watched the birds at the feeders, the little mouse footprints in the snow took me by surprise. Of course, they are not hibernators but I didn't expect them scurrying across the glistening landscape.

In moments of despair, I have thought what good can come from all this winter, and yet, I know. As buds swell, flowers burst into colorful display, I remember again.

And so it is with Holy Week. We have watched along with the first followers of Jesus as he was arrested, tried, ridiculed, and crucified. All but a few of the women were overwhelmed with fear and hid their association with the man they had just called the Messiah. What kind of Messiah gets executed? Where was his mighty power? Together they hid from the authorities. What good could come from their being arrested?

What good could come of Jesus' death? Jesus was dead. Hope was dead. And yet, we know. Those early disciples did too, but had forgotten Jesus teachings, or could not comprehend his words at the time he spoke them....not until they encountered him again, heard him speak again, shared breakfast on the beach once again.

Our joy at seeing the first snowdrops or crocus is a mere shadow of the remarkable joy the disciples felt when they saw Jesus once again. While we react to the renewed life we see, they responded to the new life they were promised. We say, "aha, it is spring again." They said, "aha this is what Jesus meant." We want to get outside and walk or run with a new freedom. They became aware of the new life Jesus had promised and gladly spread the Good News.

We, too, hear the Good News and are filled with the hope it brings. We are drawn to acts of kindness and compassion. We are empowered to work for justice so all can live rich and full lives. We recognize our blessings and responsibilities as Christians.

Finally, the tough winter is coming to a close, having delivered one of the coldest and snowiest Februaries on record. Last summer delivered record breaking heat. If we listen, we hear how the way we live is affecting life on this planet.

What good can come of reminding us of these things? We have the opportunity to rejoice in the beauty all around and then resolve to preserve it, for us, our children and grandchildren, and all creation and to spread the Good News.

In line with this thinking of the seasons, I encourage everyone to bring in photographs, paintings, or poems about the seasons. We'll hang them in the Parish Hall so we can celebrate God's creation together and be moved to care for the planet.

Our children will be presenting the Creation Pageant on Children's Sunday and a full display of God's creative gifts would be a great compliment. We'll keep the display up until after Children's Sunday.

~CHRISTIAN EDUCATION~

We anticipate the joys of spring when living things begin to appear and gives us hope for a new beginning. The Church School has been working hard on giving the gift of hope and a new beginning for families living in hunger and poverty through Heifer International. Our goal is to raise \$1,500.00. This amount would allow us to purchase 22 sets of bees, a Llama, a goat, a sheep, a pig, 2 trio of rabbits, chicks and 2 sets of tree saplings. These animals with training give an impoverished family a chance to change their lives for the better. With their promise to pass on the first born to another family a whole community is transformed. If you would like to donate to help make a difference the Church School will be hosting a carwash May 9th from 9-2 at the Columbia Old Firehouse and the cost is \$5.00 per car. What a great way to help make a difference for those in need.
