## **From the Pastor's Porch**

This winter has been so different from last year. We had that freak snow storm in October and then relatively warm temperatures for months. But we have had a bit of snow now and again and more may be on its way. Ice has formed along rivers and lakes and on birdbaths. I am reminded of the great ice jams on rivers that can cause terrible flooding until they break loose to allow the water down its intended path. What breaks the ice in our lives can only be love.

It feels a bit trite to talk about love in February, the month of Valentine's Day with all the commercialism that has developed around it. Yet, as we continue to read about Jesus' ministry, we see again how love is what God is all about – all of the time. Love, in all its variations, is what we as followers of Christ should be all about – reflecting God's love, which is given freely to each of us, onto everyone and everything we encounter. We are commanded to love God with all our heart and soul and mind, and to love each other, and to love ourselves. "For God so love the world that he gave his only son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." John 3: 16. Eugene Peterson in The Message, the Bible in commentary language, goes on to say, "[The Son] came to help, to put the world right again." We are now the ones to continue Jesus' work of putting the world right again.

In the Apostle Paul's letter's, he makes clear we are all given particular gifts and talents by God, God who knows how all the pieces fit to usher in the realm of God. Find and honor your passion. See it as the treasure God has given to you to be used toward "putting the world right again." Certainly we may not agree on how to do this, but if we are open to the movement of the Spirit, if we listen to each other with our hearts, with love, and not our egos or boxed in expectations and assertions, we just might see the ice begin to shift and the water of life flow freely.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 22. It is the beginning of a period of time for self-examination, for freeing ourselves from the ice jams in our hearts, in our approaches to life and to others. Plan to join us for worship throughout Lent in our preparation for more fully understanding the greatest gift of all.
