FROM THE PASTOR'S PORCH

The other day I brought in some of the wood that I stored on the porch. Snow had blown onto the tarp-covered Deacon's Bench, but the firewood was dry. It was a cold and raw evening and the warmth of a fire seemed a good plan. We haven't had many, as the winter has given us more unseasonably warm days than usual. The expected snowstorms of February simply did not come about this year. It seems to be more evidence that our climate patterns are changing.

I have been following the Ecumenical Lenten Carbon Fast again this year. It is a project of the New England Regional Environmental Ministries and offers a daily contemplation on the environment and course of action toward reducing the damage being done. Often there has been a link to further information. From a NASA report I have learned that 97% of climate scientists believe human activity has had an adverse effect on the climate; that CO2 levels have jumped remarkably since 1950; there are at least 8 indicators of rapid climate change; and there is no question that increased levels of greenhouse gases must cause the Earth to warm. I have also learned what we eat effects climate change; and there are big and small things we can each do to help slow catastrophic change. I will be putting some of this information in the fellowship hall for your perusal.

We are in the season of Lent which calls us to a period of reflection on how we live our lives and how we live out the Great Commandment: Love God with all our hearts and soul, and mind, and to love neighbor as ourselves. I understand neighbor as all others living on this planet and even the planet itself (earth, sky, and waters). We are to repent our failure to do what is right in God's eyes. Repentance includes developing a system or rule of life that helps keep us from being repeat offenders.

It would be so easy to get overwhelmed and discouraged, and simply throw up our hands in futility, or worse, not care since we will probably be gone from this earth by the time it gets really bad. However, as Easter people, we can have hope. The life, death and resurrection of Jesus give us reason to have hope. For God so love the world...

On Palm Sunday we can celebrate as Jesus enters Jerusalem, for we know him to be the Messiah. On Maundy Thursday we will remember Jesus having a final meal with his disciples and then experience their betrayal and desertion. On Good Friday we recall Jesus' trial and crucifixion and we feel the grief of those who knew and loved him. These are dark services, but important if we are truly to feel the joy and hope of Easter morning. On Easter morning at the sunrise service we will worship as the light dispels the darkness.

With God all things are possible. Even a world heading toward destruction can be saved. With faith in God's grace, we can bring about changes in human behavior. Not everyone will want to hear what we have to say, follow where we lead. We should expect to irritate folks, just as Jesus did. God will give us wisdom, courage and strength for the work of peace, transformation and salvation.

Walking through the wilderness of this life with hope in the Risen Christ,
