### FROM THE PASTOR'S PORCH

It is raining and quite warm and muggy for this fall day, but I am sitting on the porch anyway. I take every opportunity to be out here because I know days warm enough to do so are limited now. Amazing how much more we appreciate something when we know we are going to lose it.

Soon the leaves that have begun to take on color will drift down to be raked up and put in a compost pile, or burned. Remember when everyone was burning their leaves. We lived in Westfield NJ then, and everyone raked their leaves to the edge of the street and then burned them, so as we drove by the distinctive aroma floated in the windows. I love that smell. I know now that it was just terrible for our lungs, especially those who had breathing problems to begin with, but I remember that time with affection - helping my dad rake and watching the plumes of smoke dance into the air...and then trying to get away from the smoke that suddenly blew in my direction. Many years later, John and I burned leaves with our daughter in back of our house in Ardmore, PA. It wasn't as much fun as I remembered it.

One of our past- times when we visited our grandparents in Cornwall in the fall was raking leaves. We would rake massive piles of maple leaves and then bury each other in the piles. The one buried would wait for the beckoned adults to come out to see the piles and then the "monster" would erupt from the pile, and everyone screamed with surprise. Of course, they knew what was going on and performed as required, but we children didn't know that.

Well, here I sit, the cars swishing by on wet Route 87. I look forward to the changing leaves that will soon rustle under my steps, to stacking fire wood, and to the smell of stews and pot roasts and soup filling the house. And I feel so blessed to be able to enjoy the changing season without the fear of how I will stay warm or where I will be able to find food. I can look forward to scrumptious winter meals because I have so much.

So as I sit on this Sabbath day soaking in the blessings of having a home, a job, friends and family, and great memories, I have become conscious of those who do not. Maybe that is what Sabbath is for: to hear Christ's call to share a portion of what we have with others so no one goes hungry, to soak in our blessings and become aware of those who cannot do the same, for whatever reason. Sabbath is more than a time for being conscious of and connecting with God, to pray, and to read and ponder scripture, to spend meaningful time with friends and family, to rest and recharge one's batteries for the week ahead. It is a time to be open to the voice of the Spirit and allow it to penetrate the self that gets too busy with selfish endeavors. For this we must quiet ourselves enough to receive the Spirit's message.

The rain, which was not in the prediction I heard this morning, continues to fall, trickles down the drain spout and splashes on the stones. The orange of the maple leaves across the street peak through the purple of the maple beyond the dogwood which flashes it's red berries close to the porch. I give thanks and recommit myself to doing the work Jesus began: caring for the least of these. I hope you will join me. Enjoy cutting pumpkins into jack-o-lanterns, baking pumpkin bread, dressing your children up in costumes, and sitting around the dinner table with family enjoying a warm meal (or remember when you did this before children grew up or various friends and family moved away), and make Sabbath an important time for you to reconnect with the Holy.

## The Church Fair Committee Could Use Some Help:

**Publicity** help: newspapers, newsletters, web site, distribute signs and/or posters—someone to do year-round publicity would be wonderful. The good part is that you don't have to do crafts to help out.

Do some **Food Crafts**: Make up mixes, snowman soup ideas, tea gifts, come up with interesting ways to wrap candy or popcorn that would make cute, inexpensive gifts. Brainstorm some ideas or run even just one workshop just before the fair.

Attic Treasures: Ask for treasures and set up a time and place for people to bring them, set up the rooms on the Thursday before the fair, check Friday night for additional donations and Saturday morning for additional donations and you can open way before the fair...usually 9 am or whenever you see someone pop in. We don't usually put prices on everything. If something special comes in, it is ok to do that. Most of the time is it dickering. And you can schedule people to work the room. We have suggestions. Also we know where to donate which items that don't sell. This only takes up a few days around fair time and makes close to 20% of the fair's profits.

Run an **evening workshop**. You don't have to meet every week. You can meet once a month or just often enough to finish one project or to start a project and send it home with group members (and making sure you get everything back.) If you can look at an item, read the directions, and work from a kit, we can make up kits for you. You could help make up the kits, if that's your style.

We are looking for **different ideas to add to the fair to make it more fun**. In the past, we have had a Scarves and Jewelry Room; a pie-making workshop for the bake sale (this year we would like to have two pie workshops;) a Country Store with cheese, candy, and home canned goods. Perhaps you have been to a fair or bazaar somewhere and have seen something different that you could share with us. And... we have **day workshops** on Wednesday mornings from 10 to noon. Stop in and visit.
