

A couple of weeks ago, I attended my fiftieth high school reunion. The fifty years since I left Xavier High School has seemingly gone by in a wink of an eye. One day a 134 pound Catholic kid heading off to college with trepidation and the next day a 250 pound Protestant minister coming back. (That last part is a real rarity for a Catholic school!)

Prior to this year, I'd only been back to the school a couple of times, but for this reunion I thought, since I live nearby, it would be fun to get involved. So, I joined up with five other alums last winter to form a committee to plan the big event. We chose a date, location, food and then made personal phone invitations to classmates. We also came up with a chapel service to remember classmates and faculty who have passed into Eternal Care. All of this was in coordination with a "Homecoming Day" that included a football game (We won!).

During my calls to alums, they frequently said "I won't know anybody anymore." Or, they had some unresolved complaint about their school experience that would not allow them to return. I tried to change those negative views, but to be honest I didn't overcome many objections. That is too bad, because it was a great event for those who attended. I reconnected with many guys I hadn't seen in five decades. We all went in very different paths: Rich played Triple A ball before returning to the school to become the baseball coach and guidance counselor, Joe just retire as the XHS athletic director, Jim is a doctor, Ted is a lawyer (not the bad kind), Greg an engineer, Tom is a retired policeman, Al was a fireman; they and others, all had very different life experiences. However, once we were reunited there was camaraderie and goodnatured fun grounded in a common history. They all look older (not me) but still knew each other. My classmates who chose to stay away missed out on a wonderful, once-in-a-lifetime experience.

Homecomings are a big part of the fall. However, for some, they can engender fear, trepidation and reminders of a hurtful past. Coming home, for a family dinner or even to attend church, is sometimes difficult. I certainly understand that some past experiences are open wounds that continue to remain painful, yet there are times when the pain we carry is left unhealed by our own stubborn desire to not let it go. Healing and forgiveness happen much more easily, if we open ourselves to the possibilities. In retrospect, I wish I'd been more persuasive to my recalcitrant classmates, for some it could have helped mend old hurts.

I pray that all of your homecomings bring renewal and joy to your life and the lives of those around you.
