OLD TESTAMENT: Psalm 1 - Lay Reader Sue Milici

¹ Happy are those who do not follow the advice of the wicked or take the path that sinners tread, or sit in the seat of scoffers; ² but their delight is the law of the LORD, and on his law they meditate day and night. They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither. In all that they do, they prosper. ⁴ The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away. ⁵ Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous. ⁶ For the LORD watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

NEW TESTAMENT: Acts 1: 15-17, 21-26 Lay Reader Sue Milici

¹ In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) ¹⁶ and said, "Friends, the Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus. ¹⁷ For he numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry."

²¹ So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, ²² beginning from baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us. One of these must become a witness with us of his resurrection.” ²³ So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas who was also known as Justus and Matthias. ²⁴ Then they prayed and said, “Lord, you know everyone’s heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen ²⁵ to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.” ²⁶ And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell to Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

NOTES ON THE TEXT

Both texts focus on the need for prayer; to remain connected to God to know more of God’s plan and purpose to be able to enact and move on that plan and purpose and to receive the fullest blessings.

In Psalm 1, the psalmist is forming the connection between how our following God's law impacts our well being, both communal and personal. Our harmonizing the two is what fosters spiritual wholeness, and from that wholeness, comes the blessings of greater insights. We need both, the laws and a spiritual life, and it is up to us to align them so that we reap the riches of what God offers. So...to "delight in the Law of the Lord", and to "meditate on it day and night" is what invites the promise of blessing.

Acts 1: 15-17, 21-26 Now, we do not typically choose our spiritual leaders with a flip of the coin, or name drawn from a hat...can you imagine if we did!? Nonetheless, here we have one of the first congregational meetings in history happening and the selection criteria comes down to the casting of lots. While it may sound overly simple and risky, the process is imbued with faith and prayer:

- Believing that prayer connected them to a deeper insight and power, they prayed for God's wisdom to guide them, and
- the person chosen would have to be someone who had been a witness to Jesus' life and ministry and to His resurrection.

These early believers, who are the founders of our church, understood that what had happened was the fulfillment of scriptural prophecies and so it was natural for them to live and act with a very clear sense of God's sovereignty; that the events of history need to be understood against a backdrop of the plan and purposes of an almighty God.
