¹² "Observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy, as the LORD your God has commanded you. ¹³ Six days you shall labor and do all your work, ¹⁴ But the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God; you shall not do any work, you, or your son or daughter, or your male or female slave, or your ox, your donkey or any of your livestock, or the resident alien in your towns, so that your male and female slave may rest, as well as you. do. ¹⁵ Remember, that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and that the LORD your God brought you out of there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm; therefore the LORD your God commanded you to keep the sabbath day.

New Testament Mark 2: 23-3: 6 Sue Milici

²³ One sabbath he was going through the grain fields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. ²⁴ The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?"

²⁵ And he said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? ²⁶ He entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest and ate the bread of the Presence which is not lawful for any but priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions." ²⁷ Then he said to them, "The Sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the Sabbath; ²⁸ So the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath"

3 Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand.

² They watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so they might accuse him. ³ And he said to the man who had the withered hand. "Come forward."

⁴ Then he said to them, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. ⁵ He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He

stretched it out, and his hand was restored. ⁶The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him.

NOTES ON THE TEXT

Deuteronomy 5:12-15

You may or may not realize that the Ten Commandments were recorded in order of importance. The first three commandments concern Our obligation to God. The next seven concern our duty to neighbor.

The First Commandment addresses loyalty. (And since loyalty to a national God defined one's allegiance to his or her people, religious loyalty was synonymous with patriotism.)

The Second Commandment addresses respect for power. In Ancient times, names had significant meaning that was thought to reveal inner power and character. Therefore, using someone's name was believed to manipulate that person's power. This commandment demanded respect for God's name and, therefore, God's power.

And since the Hebrews existed because of God's power. They were not to abuse that power by needlessly evoking God's name.

The Third Commandment addresses freedom under God. Now, being free from something, allows freedom of choice. So, God freed the people from ongoing servitude so they could worship and be re-created. Hence, everyone and everything observed this sacred time of rest so they could be renewed. Sabbath freed the believer from work, so the believer could choose God and allow God to show God's creative power.

Mark 2: 23-3:6

Today's Gospel shows again the problems that Jesus posed for the authorities of His day. The issue in question is the purpose of the Sabbath.

The law governing the Sabbath had its origins in the Ten Commandments given to Moses (see above) - but by the time of Jesus the commandments had become more and more complex. Rules, rules and more rules! They tried to nail down precisely what counted as work and what did not - even the distance someone could walk on the Sabbath - all were laid down and carefully observed.

To the Pharisees, picking ears of corn classified as work and was forbidden on the Sabbath - even if the disciples were hungry and this was all they had to eat. Jesus reminds them of an incident in which David bent the Law in order that he and his men could eat.

Then he highlights the fact that a law given for the good of God's people was actually a burden to them. Instead of enjoying their day of rest and spending precious time in worshipping God - they were concerned not to transgress any of the additional rules imposed on the Sabbath.

The Sabbath was given for human creatures - not the other way around.

To make the point still further, Jesus goes into the synagogue and brings a man with a withered arm into the middle of the gathering. Then, He asks the simple question - is it against the law to do good on the Sabbath - or to save a life? Needless to say, His critics have no answer.

Jesus is angry that they are not prepared to reflect on the question - and so offers an answer that they must have suspected was coming: He heals the man.

The answer to the question is, of course, self-evident - and the healing of the man cannot be seen as doing evil on the Sabbath. But the reaction of the critics is not to think again - to reflect on the meaning of the Sabbath. Rather it is to see Jesus as a threat to good order - and to their position.

Even at this early stage of his Gospel, Mark makes clear that such confrontations led to Jesus' opponents to being the plots which were to lead eventually to His death.
